Like dancers Nicole Wolcott & Larry Keigwin, they provided a path for exploring our inner most thoughts, and sparked understanding of and empathy for each other.

Artists' unique ability to span ideas, time, and peoples is central to Ovations' vision and mission. Our artists are chosen first and foremost for their high artistic quality and equally for their expertise working in and with communities, creating magical moments when artists and audiences connect and inspiring the creative self in all of us. We seek out artists, such as Alvin Ailey dancers or Les Ballets Trockadero de Monte Carlo, who can resonate with Mainers, illuminate our souls, lift our spirits, swell our hearts, and, of course, entertain.



Live performance is an act of instant community, bringing us together for a singular, shared experience that cannot be replicated—whether we were dancing together at Port City Music Hall or exploring the surrounding gallery works at MECA during the uniquely sited American Contemporary Music Ensemble. 

# **Ovations is EDUCATION**

sharing the joy and power of the performing arts with young people in our community.

At our School-Time Performances students went under the sea. wondered about gravity, participated in a Civil Rights movement sit-in, and observed gorillas in the wild with Jane Goodall. They discovered new ideas and ways of being and found community through the stories onstage. Our collaboration with the Portland Museum of Art and Theater Ensemble of Color to present an adaptation of acclaimed author and artist Ashley Bryan's Beautiful Blackbird gave young black youth in our community a chance to see people just like themselves, and for their culture to be the dominant narrative of the day. It was magical to witness Mr. Bryan sitting in the sold-out performance enjoying his work with an energetic audience of elementary students. Ovations teaching artists worked with 8th grade students to help them process "Right to Dream's" Civil Rights themes and how those intertwine with their own lives. Students from Mt. Blue Regional High School made the 90-minute trip to Portland and participated in a joyous post-performance "Page to Stage" workshop with the actor from the one-man show Call of the Wild.

"This performance was an amazing opportunity to expose students to something they may never had the chance to experience. Many students were awestruck and one student told me, 'That was one of the most beautiful things I've ever seen.'" - Mrs. Eppler, Village Elementary, Gorham (Airplay)

We also offered our first vacation theater camp over February break. The participants put together a play in a week and their pride was infectious at the post-performance t-shirt signing. It was a year we are all proud to look back on as we continue to create doors and mirrors for young people through the performing arts.

By actively seeking and curating programming as both our civic and artistic duty, in our FY19 season Ovations provided nearly 30 masterclasses, workshops, panel discussions, and pre-performance lectures, serving over 2,000 people.

We provided electrifying lectures and panel discussions from a variety of community voices, including artist and co-founder of Indigo Arts Alliance, Daniel Minter, who connected the African cultural diaspora for us; and Mary Hunter, Bowdoin College emerita professor of music, who explored the violin's indispensable role in chamber music. We provided teaching and learning opportunities with internationally renowned classical musicians ranging from Inon Barnaton to the Dover Quartet, as well as Alvin Ailey dancers; choreographers Larry Keigwin and Raffaelle Morra, Ballet Master for Les Ballets Trockaderos, all appealing to novices, students, and professionals. And we created intimate opportunities for Members and other community members to get up close and personal with our artists, who come from and travel worldwide, bringing their stories as well as their expertise to Maine. For the many of you who participated in one or another of these events, we hope you emerged feeling stronger and more connected - to the art, to this special place, to each other.

# Ovations is **EVERYWHERE**

### We meet you where you play, where you work, where you learn.

In our 2018-19 season, we presented 38 mainstage performances in five different venues across Portland, from Merrill Auditorium to the intimate One Longfellow Square. We crafted and implemented over 60 Offstage activities – including masterclasses, free lectures, and meet the artist opportunities – animating community spaces as varied as Falmouth's St Mary's Church or Portland's Coffee by Design. We welcomed student groups from over 51 towns into our School-Time Performances at Merrill and at the University of Southern Maine's Hannaford Hall.

Our impact was both broader and deeper than ever before. We generated nearly 45,000 arts and community experiences for the Greater Portland region, including over 10,000 students, all in service to our vision to make the performing arts "a vital part of everyday life."


